## **About the Japan Society of Food Factors (JSoff)**

After the first International Conference on Food Factors (ICoFF) in Hamamatsu, Japan, in 1995, interest in the scientific study of "functional food factors" based on solid evidence surged significantly. The conference far exceeded expectations, attracting nearly 1,000 participants and fostering lively, in-depth discussions across disciplines. Inspired by the overwhelming enthusiasm and feedback that this should be an ongoing event, the Japan Society of Food Factors (JSoff) was founded later that same year.

Today, JSoff has approximately 400 individual members and about 10 corporate or institutional supporting members. Its members are researchers from universities, public research institutions, and private enterprises who specialize in fields such as food science, medicine, pharmaceutical sciences, and nutritional science. The Society aims to promote new research related to food and health, encourage active exchange and collaboration among scientists, and ultimately improve human health.

Major Activities of JSoff include:

1. Organizing scientific meetings and conferences
2. Publishing the JSoff Letter
3. Promoting research and recognizing outstanding achievements
4. Conducting research and surveys related to functional food science
5. Supporting the organization and operation of the ICoFF conference series
6. Other activities necessary to achieve the above objectives

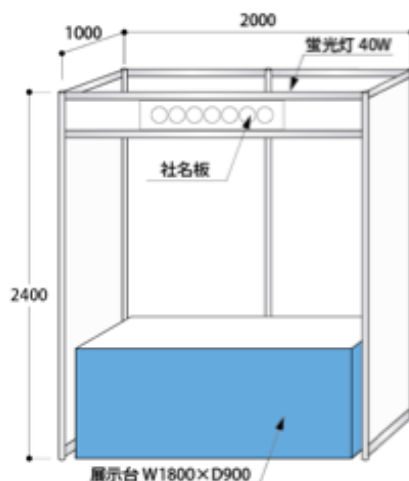
